He was scheduled to retire in September 2011 and knew he needed to be prepared for the job market. Thus, David registered with JCEP and was assigned an Employment Counselor who reached out to him immediately to schedule a one-on-one, face-to-face meeting to discuss his employment goals. David stated, "I knew they [JCEP] would be able to help but didn't know much about them until I visited with a Counselor. After the first visit, I knew JCEP would be able to help me." He went on to share, "Many of the staffing agencies just want you to come in and fill out paperwork and then that's it. JCEP stayed in contact and met with me anytime I needed or wanted to."

Although David had been in the military for twenty-five years, he felt confident that he would find employment quickly. David attributed his resume as one reason he was not finding employment. He said, "The resume I created was not getting me anywhere and when she [Employment Counselor] fixed mine, I had more people calling me for an interview." David and his Counselor worked closely to identify his skills and training and created a resume that showed his leadership and logistics experience. David wanted to find employment similar to what he loved doing in the military and he did. During our discussion David shared, "JCEP is a good place to work with. They take pride in working with Veterans and make sure they are up-to-date on all new stuff." He went on to explain, "They don't stop helping you until you find a job." When asked to sum up his experience with JCEP David said, "They are very professional and useful to job seekers. My overall feeling about JCEP is **GREAT**!"

When asked for any final thoughts, David stated, "Mary Weaver is the most wonderful person to work with and was my contact with JCEP. She was wonderful in helping me find a job. She would contact me by phone or email or both just to check on me and see how I was doing. There are not many people in this world that would do that."
